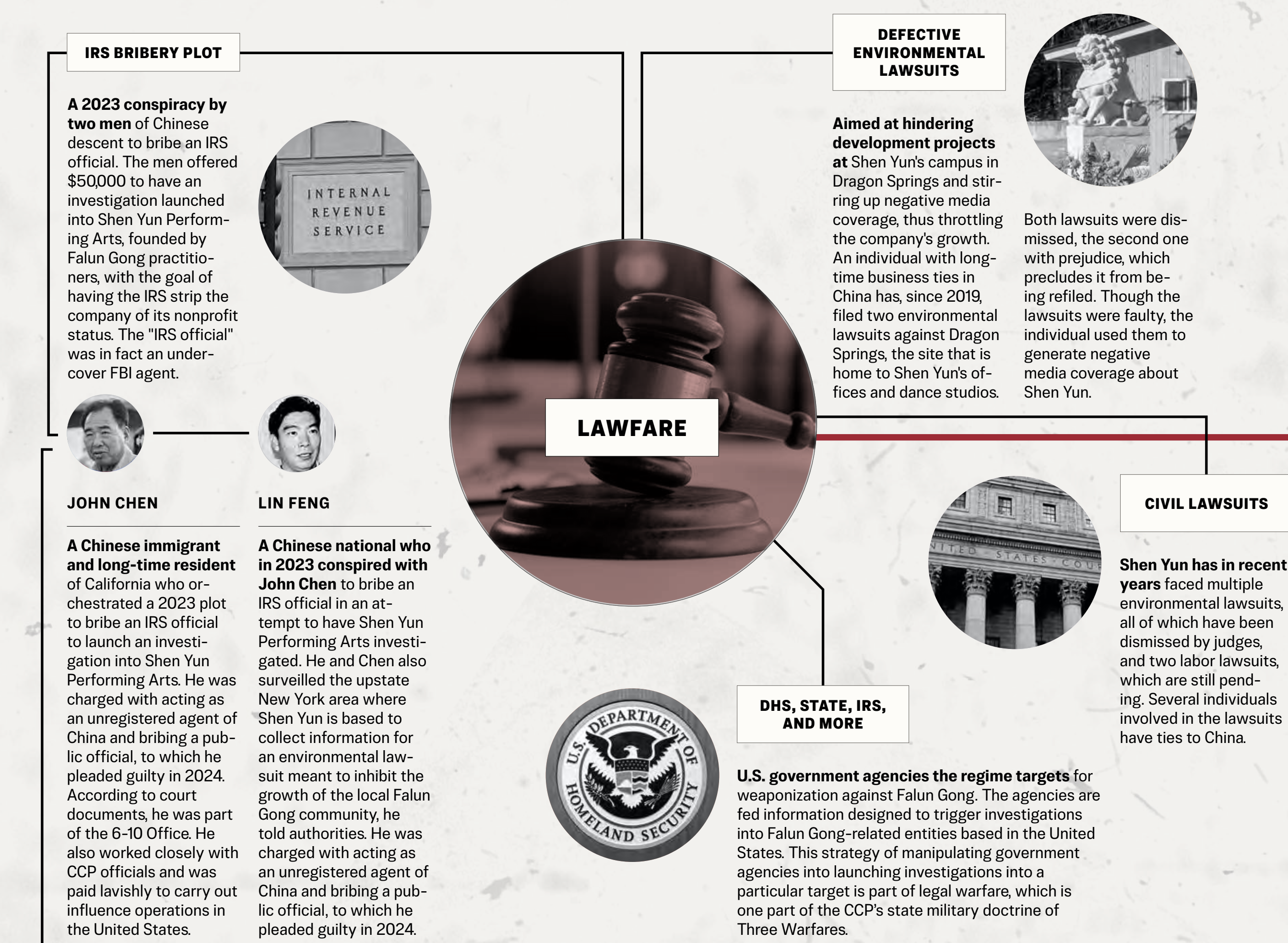


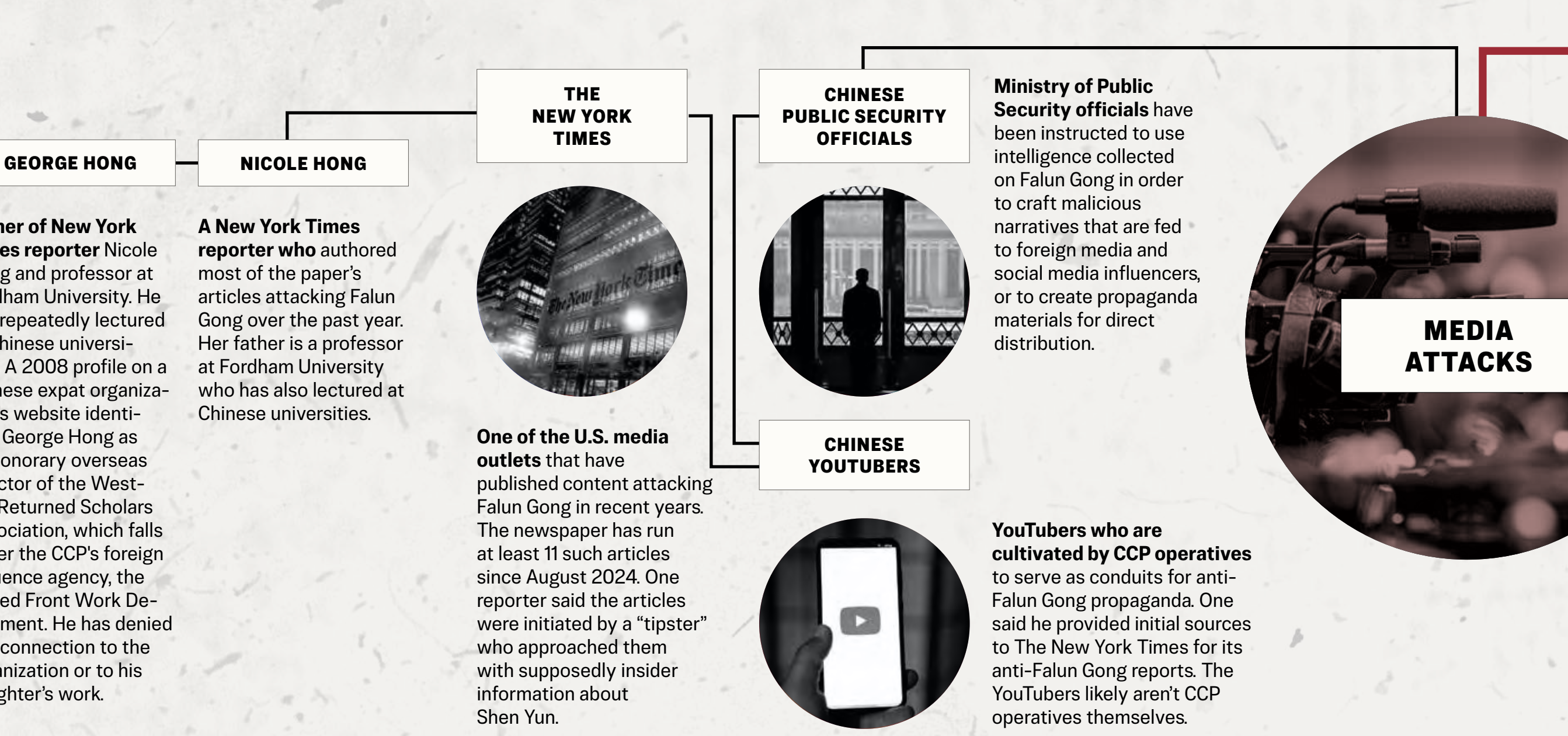
**LAWFARE:** A strategy to use law as a weapon against enemies. It involves filing frivolous lawsuits and manipulating legal systems to achieve desired outcomes, such as having a target investigated by authorities. It's part of the CCP's military doctrine of "Three Warfares."



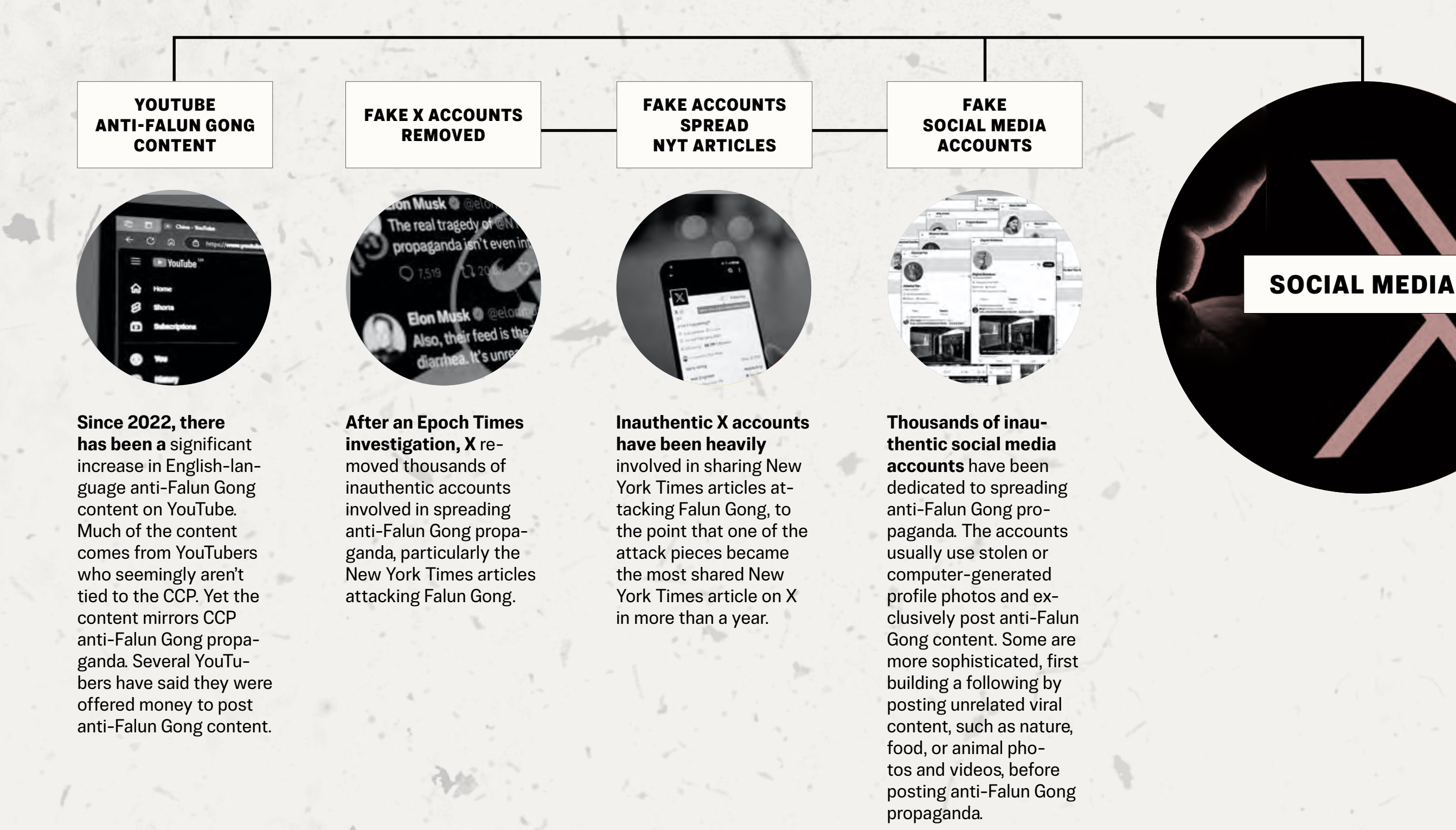
**COVERT OPERATIONS:** Operations orchestrated by CCP agents under conditions that allow plausible deniability for the regime.



**MEDIA ATTACKS:** A common tactic used by the CCP to discredit enemies. Malicious information is fed to reporters of media outlets that aren't directly tied to the CCP in order to give the material credibility. The information is often partially true, which helps to convince the reporter that a broader false narrative is plausible.



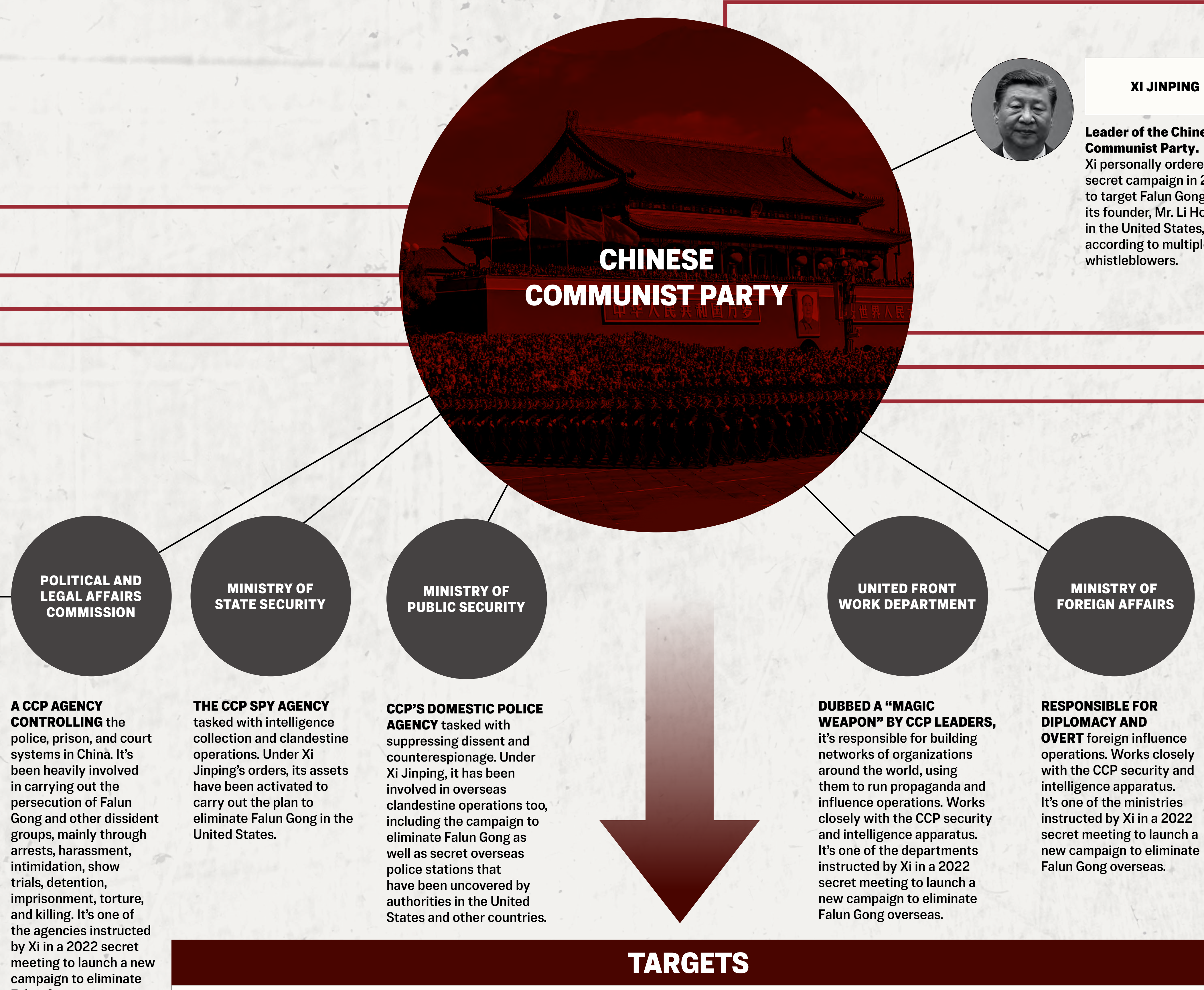
**SOCIAL MEDIA:** A campaign to spread anti-Falun Gong propaganda through fake social media accounts, covert CCP propaganda video channels, and malicious information fed to social media influencers.



# CCP Transnational Repression in the US

**AFTER BRUTALLY PERSECUTING THE FALUN GONG** faith group in China for 26 years, the Chinese Communist Party has developed a new strategy to target Falun Gong in the United States. According to multiple whistleblowers, the regime is using undercover operatives and its spy agencies, in attempts to turn public opinion against Falun Gong in the United States and utilize the U.S. government and legal system against the group.

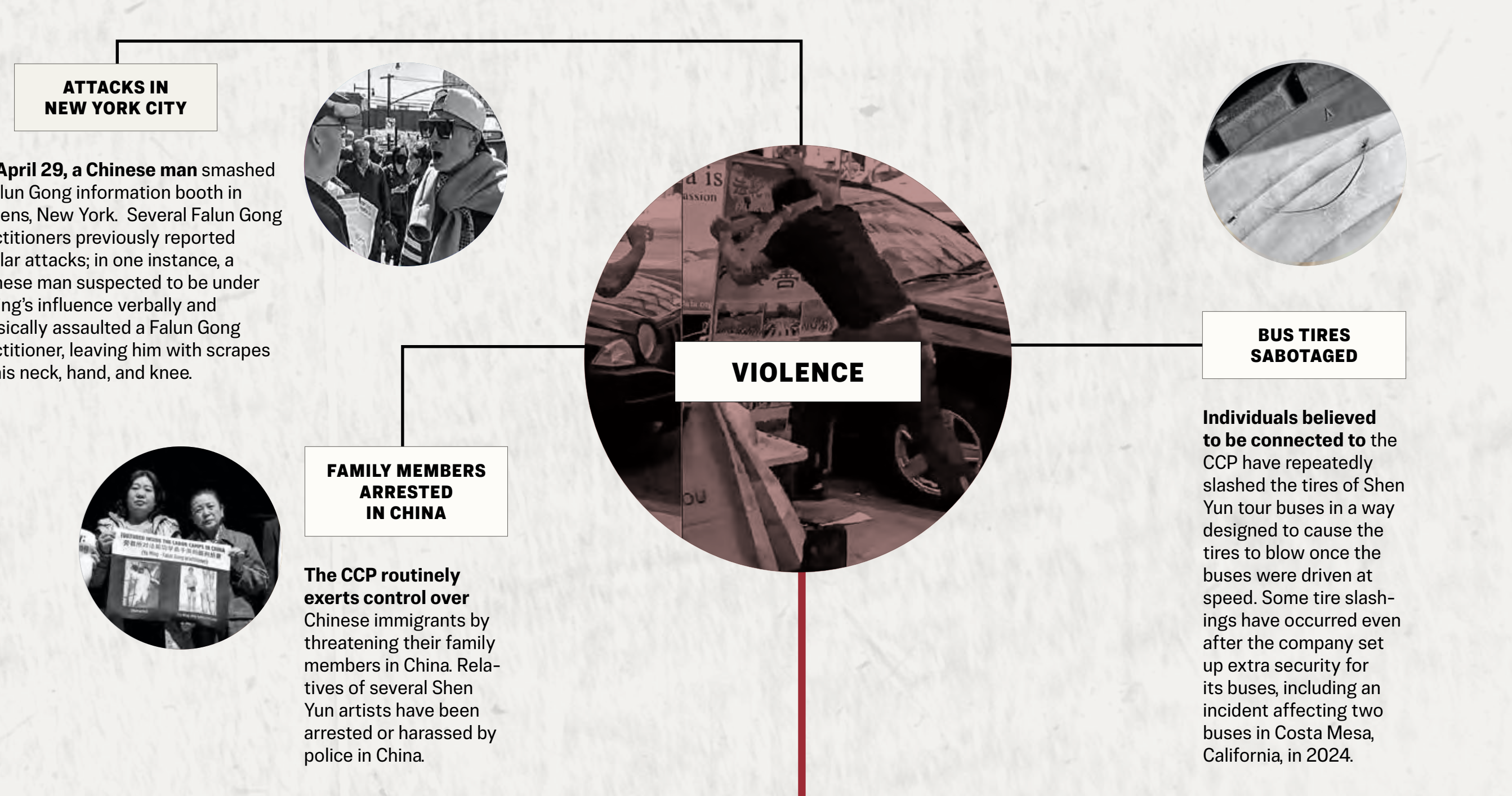
**BOMB THREATS AND THREATS OF VIOLENCE:** Targeted threats, usually sent by email, aimed at disrupting Shen Yun's performances and intimidating people and organizations associated with Falun Gong. CCP agents have sent more than 140 such bomb threats and death threats since 2024, according to numbers from the Falun Dafa Information Center. Some threats are directed at theaters to disrupt scheduled Shen Yun shows, while others are sent to Shen Yun's campus in upstate New York. Some of the emails have been tracked to China by U.S. and Taiwanese authorities, including to the Huawei Institute of Technology in Xi'an.



**PAID PROTESTS:** The CCP has long been known to pay people to stage protests on its behalf. Recently, however, there's evidence the regime is specifically paying non-Chinese people to stage such protests in order to increase their credibility. Several such protests have occurred in New York City since 2024.



**VIOLENCE:** CCP operatives have long been involved in acts of violence against Falun Gong on U.S. soil. Some examples include the break-in and brutal beating of Epoch Times CTO and Falun Gong practitioner Peter Li at his home, as well as several violent incidents during the CCP's 2008 campaign to organize anti-Falun Gong mobs in the Flushing neighborhood, home of the largest Chinese population in New York City.



**HACKING AND CYBERCRIME:** The CCP has long been known to use hacking and other cybercrime as tools against its targets. Dissidents have repeatedly reported their website and email accounts getting hacked.
