- Says she wants federal protections and insurance coverage for in vitro fertilization (IVF) treatments.

TRUMP Border & Immigration HARRIS

- Pledges to restore the border policies of the first Trump administration.
- Calls for completing the border wall and using technology to monitor the border.
- Promises to “carry out the largest deportation operation in American history.”
- Supports increasing the number of Border Patrol agents.
- Calls for deploying the U.S. Navy to combat fentanyl smuggling.
- Seeks to increase penalties for crossing the border illegally and overstaying visas.
- Says he wants to reinstate the “remain in Mexico” and travel ban policies.
- Promises to invoke the Alien Enemies Act to “remove all known or suspected gang members, drug dealers, or cartel members from the United States.”
- Says he wants to use Title 42 to end child trafficking.
- Promises to cut federal funding to sanctuary cities and jurisdictions that refuse to cooperate with federal immigration authorities.
- Says he wants to advance a “merit-based immigration” system.
- Pledges to revoke visas for foreign nationals who support terrorism and jihadism.
- Says he wants to automatically award permanent resident cards to noncitizen graduates of U.S. colleges and universities.
- Promises to push Congress to pass legislation to ban sanctuary jurisdictions.

- Pledges to support the border bill that failed twice in the Senate in 2024 and vows to sign it into law when elected, if Congress passes it.
- Calls for increasing the number of Border Patrol agents.
- Vows to support providing nearly \$20 billion in funding to hire 4,300 new asylum officers, increasing illegal-drug screenings, expanding ICE detention capacity, and guaranteeing legal counsel for children who crossed the border illegally.
- Says she suggests investing in new technology to block the flow of fentanyl entering the country.
- Calls the immigration system “broken” and suggests reforms including “earned pathways to citizenship.”
- Supports providing Immigration and Customs Enforcement with \$8 billion in emergency funding, including funding to expand the capacity of detention facilities.
- Says she wants to grant conditional permanent resident status to Afghans who fled to the United States following the withdrawal of the U.S. military in 2021.
- Supports providing up to 10,000 special immigrant visas to family members of Afghan allies.
- Says she wants to increase employment-based visas by 13 percent and family-based visas by 7 percent through 2030.

- Pledges to ensure national independence in essential goods and services by boosting domestic production.
- Seeks to revive the U.S. auto industry by cutting red tape, canceling “the electric vehicle mandate,” and preventing Chinese imports.
- Supports AI innovation and development.
- Says he would establish a strong manufacturing industry in Near Earth Orbit, send American astronauts to the Moon and Mars, and boost ties with the commercial space sector.
- Would protect the nation’s critical infrastructure and industrial base from cyberattacks.
- Would protect American workers and farmers from unfair trade practices.
- Seeks to ensure immigration system puts American workers first.

- Pledges to “fight for unions” and sign pro-union legislation, including the PRO Act and the Public Service Freedom to Negotiate Act.
- Calls for increasing the federal minimum wage and ending subminimum wages for both tipped workers and people with disabilities.
- Would expand paid family and medical leave.
- Says she will not tolerate “unfair trade practices from China or any competitor that undermines American workers.”

TRUMP Education HARRIS

- States he supports abolishing the Department of Education.
- Seeks to cut federal funding for schools that teach critical race theory and “gender ideology” while supporting institutions that prioritize “project-based learning.”
- Promotes affordable alternatives to traditional four-year college degrees.
- Vows to support schools that focus on parental rights while ending teacher tenure and adopting teacher merit pay.
- Seeks to adopt “universal school choice” nationwide, offering vouchers for students to attend private schools.
- Advocates for the immediate suspension of violent students.
- Would reinstate the “1776 Commission, promote Fair and Patriotic Civics Education, and veto efforts to nationalize Civics Education.”
- Seeks to reduce the separation of church and state to allow the “Right to Pray and Read the Bible in school.”
- Pledges to pursue lawsuits against schools accused of discriminatory practices.
- Pledges to allow homeschool parents to use 529 education savings accounts to spend up to \$10,000 a year per child.
- Seeks to ensure homeschooling families have full access to benefits available to non-homeschooled students.

- Vows to expand child care and preschool access for parents.
- Pledges to strengthen and augment public education.
- Would continue Biden administration efforts to cancel student loan debt for certain borrowers.
- Seeks to lower the costs of college education with increased Pell Grant funding.
- Pledges to provide further investments to historically black colleges and universities.
- Suggests amplifying Biden administration programs for college opportunities, including a Pell Grant award increase of \$900.
- Says she supports increases to Title I, which sends money to schools with a higher share of students from low-income families.
- Supports the Biden administration’s expansion of Title IX.

TRUMP Manufacturing & Workers HARRIS

- Pledges to turn the United States into a “manufacturing superpower.”
- Seeks to strengthen “buy American and hire American” policies.

- Seeks to build on Biden’s Infrastructure Law and the CHIPS and Science Act to support American manufacturers and workers.
- Says she supports American

TRUMP Housing HARRIS

- Promises to lower mortgage rates by bringing inflation down.
- Supports opening limited portions of federal land for new home construction.
- Would increase homeownership through tax incentives and support for first-time homebuyers.
- Would cut any unnecessary regulations that increase housing costs.

- Promises to build 3 million new homes in four years to address the national housing shortage.
- Suggests cutting regulatory red tape to increase the speed of home construction.
- Calls on Congress to pass legislation to outlaw price-fixing by corporate landlords.
- Would provide first-time homebuyers with a \$25,000 subsidy on their down payments.
- Pledges to offer tax incentives for home builders who construct affordable homes for first-time buyers.

TRUMP Energy & Environment HARRIS

- Promises to lift restrictions on American energy production and make energy more abundant and affordable.

- Promises to lower household energy costs and create millions of energy jobs.

- Calls for making the United States “the dominant energy producer in the world.”
- Would increase oil drilling on public lands and offer tax breaks to oil, gas, and coal producers.
- Says he wants to roll back Biden incentives and regulations that promote electric vehicles over traditional automobiles.
- Pledges to re-exit the Paris Agreement on climate action.
- Promises to boost energy production from all sources, including nuclear.

- Would promote “environmental justice.”
- Would continue infrastructure investments into renewable energy projects.
- Vows to hold environmental polluters of both air and water accountable.
- Vows to protect public lands and public health and increase resilience to climate disasters.
- Says climate change is an existential threat.
- Reversed her stance on fracking, saying she has supported it since 2020.
- Touts the Biden administration’s increase in domestic oil production and says the country cannot be overly reliant on foreign oil.

- Says he will “always defend your Second Amendment right to keep and bear arms.”
 - Previously banned bump stocks, in late 2018; the ban was overturned in January 2023 by a federal appeals court.
 - Repealed a law that required the Social Security Administration to send mental health information to the national background check system.
 - Expressed support in 2018 for “red flag” gun laws, stating, “Take the guns first, go through due process second.”
 - Criticized Republicans who supported in 2022 a gun control bill that included red flag laws.
 - Vows to undo regulations on pistol braces and roll back Biden’s “zero tolerance” policy that revokes federal licenses from firearm dealers who violate gun laws.
 - Vows to repeal all Biden administration executive orders on gun owners and manufacturers during his first week of office.

- Says she is “in favor of the Second Amendment” and “in favor of reasonable gun safety laws.”
- Has called for a total ban on “assault weapons,” a term used to describe some types of semiautomatic rifles, via executive action if Congress does not pass legislation.
- Vows to implement universal background checks for firearm purchases.
- Supports red flag laws.
- Blames existing gun laws for the rise in school shootings.

- Pledges to support Israel and to seek peace in the Middle East.
- Plans to “rebuild our alliance network in the region to ensure a future of peace, stability, and prosperity.”

- Would ensure NATO allies meet their financial obligations to the organization.
- Would champion the sovereignty and independence of nations in the Indo-Pacific.

- Says he will “quickly restore law and order” and public safety in the United States, and he “stands with the heroes of law enforcement.”
 - Pledges to deliver “record funding” to police departments, hire new officers, and protect them from “frivolous lawsuits.”
 - Pledges to strengthen penalties for assaults on law enforcement and “surge federal prosecutors and the National Guard into high-crime communities.”
 - Supports decriminalizing marijuana and Florida’s Amendment 3, which would legalize recreational marijuana for adult use.

- Highlights her “smart on crime” progressive approach to the justice system during her tenure as San Francisco district attorney, which included opposing the death penalty and reducing recidivism for nonviolent offenders.
- Highlights her support of a minimum 90-day jail sentence for possession of a concealed or loaded weapon for gun violence offenders.
- Briefly defended the “defund the police” movement in 2020 before speaking against it months later after joining the Biden campaign.
- Supports starting a national registry to keep track of police misconduct, called the National Law Enforcement Accountability Database.
- Supports decriminalizing marijuana.

- Supports Taiwan’s self-defense against China, in line with the current policy.
